## Youth Perspective on the Post Graduate Environment

Six months ago, I was sitting at my laptop staring at a screen with a list of colleges I’d vaguely heard about. I was applying to the University of Toronto, one of the only universities in North America to have constituency colleges within its structure, modelled after the Oxbridge system. For me, it was a big deal which constituency college I chose. After all, not only would it determine where I lived and the academic opportunities I would have, it would also determine the kind of people and social culture I would be surrounded by.

The safest option seemed to be St. Michael’s College; its “Catholic” label seemed to assure me that my social conservative outlook would be at least tolerated, if not shared. But somehow it just didn’t seem right to choose St. Michael’s. Traditionally, the Anglican-aligned Trinity College has been associated with the political science and international relations programs at the university, the field I had applied for and dream to work in. I was warned by University of Toronto alumni that it also has a reputation for being more socially liberal amongst the constituency colleges and that conservative-leaning voices were not welcomed in their student government

For the balance of the 2019 Membership year (*May 1, 2019-April 30, 2020*), our focus continues on delivering pro-life programs and events fulfilling our obligation to keep the pro-life message in the forefront of our local communities. We have a very active fall schedule full of life affirming events and we need your financial support.

Right to Life Mississauga & Area will once again focus on key events including 2019 40 Days for Life and Life Chain and the 2020 March for Life in Ottawa. The March for Life, where we subsidize transportation costs for local Catholic high school students, and our Youth Symposium are specifically directed towards our youth; *the future of the pro-life movement*.

We will also continue to deliver the pro-life message by hosting presentations, providing materials, including purchasing copies of the movie **UNPLANNED** for distribution to local churches and community groups, and continuing to support worthy groups embodying the pro-life cause such as Alliance for Life, Sisters of Life, Euthanasia prevention coalition and National Campus Life Network.

Four months into our fiscal year, we have collected Membership dues from *roughly 35%* of our almost 300 members). The continued support of existing members is essential, enabling us to continue to educate and deliver programs carrying the message that *“All human beings, from the moment of conception through natural death, have the right to life, the basic right on which all others depends”*.

Pastor’s Corner



In each Newsletter, our Parish Priests are invited to share their thoughts on Right to Life issues. In this 11th Edition, John A. Boissonneau - Archdiocese of Toronto offers his insights.

From the Desk of His Excellency, The Most Reverend Bishop John A. Boissonneau

We recognize that the human right to life has many, many proponents who do not profess religious faith and that their participation in the various movements and activities in support of the sanctity of life is so important. At the same time, there are a significant number of us involved in the Right to Life who are also motivated by religious principles. Synagogues, mosques and churches in their outreach and social justice activities engage their congregants in the issues of abortion and euthanasia. These faith communities are one of the foundations of the whole movement today as in the past.

A pro-life stance founded on religious or faith values is integrated as part of the whole vision of the meaning of life. The scriptures and the teaching lay the foundation and the generous outreach in witness, assistance and accompaniment give expression of these principles. But as women and men of faith we need to be more deliberate in our pro-life stance as the challenges to the right to life grow.

As the Catholic Bishop for the Western Pastoral Region of the Archdiocese of Toronto which includes Mississauga, Brampton and Caledon I invite pastors and parishioners in our parishes to consider establishing a Right to Life Committee. This parish group would bring together the many people in the parish who sponsor activities in support of life, such as the Catholic Women’s League, the Knights of Columbus, prayer groups and youth ministry. By meeting regularly three or four times a year the parish Committee can assist in the co-ordination of the many activities for greater participation and assist the pastor in keeping the current challenges to the right to life in the prayers and consciousness of the parishioners.



**UNPLANNED. A Review by Genevieve Carson, Right to Life Mississauga & Area**



I think God totally planned “UNPLANNED”, the movie. The discrimination and frenzied resistance to having it seen in North America was clearly you-know-who at work. But when we finally got to view it in theatres this past July, this true-to-life story of Abby Johnson did not disappoint. Here’s why I give UNPLANNED five stars.

Despite Pureflix creating UNPLANNED on a shoestring budget, the acting and production were top notch.

I was blown away by Abby Johnson’s complete 180 on her stance. How this church going gal was so convinced that she was helping women in her role at Planned Parenthood was dumbfounding.

I love that the movie showed pro-lifers as they are: most prayerful and compassionate with a few crazies mixed in who give us a bad rap! It captured the ruthlessness and deceit of Planned Parenthood, showing that they are first and foremost abortion providers and often at the expense of women’s well-being.

Mercy was the overriding theme of unplanned: God’s, Abby’s parents, her husband, and the 40 Days for Life participants. I think it was clever how Dr. Anthony Levitino, former abortionist, portrayed the insensitive Doctor Who performs the pivotal abortions in the movie. It struck me that this was a humbling role for a man who had so much blood on his hands before he repented.

I found it priceless that My Sleep Pillow entrepreneur, Michael Lindell (Who I believe helped fund the making of the movie) got to play the big machine operator who ripped the Planned Parenthood sign out of the ground when that companies clinic doors were finally closed.

The movie showed the all-around tragedy of abortion. But more than that, UNPLANNED left me feeling hopeful. Lives ARE saved by the prayers of people who hold vigil outside of the clinics. Conversion IS possible, for even the most deceived and hardened pro-abortionist. We are on the right track and someday this grizzly practice WILL be unthinkable.

## Change the World by Caring for Others

In 1969, Canada legalized abortion, altering the long-held principle that it is wrong to kill human life. In 1988, the Supreme Court of Canada struck down the abortion law, leaving Canada with no law upholding the right to life of children in the womb.

In February 2015, the Supreme Court of Canada struck down Canada's euthanasia and assisted suicide laws. In June 2016, the federal government legalized and regulated euthanasia and assisted suicide by giving doctors the right in law to kill their patients.

The Canadian government is now discussing extending euthanasia to children, people with psychiatric conditions and those who are incompetent but previously requested euthanasia.

You may feel that there is little or nothing we can do to make a difference in our culture to stop abortion and/or euthanasia. The Catholic Church and the Knights of Columbus recognize that there is always hope and there is always another way. We look to the parable of the Good Samaritan (Luke 10:30-37):



*A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho when he was attacked by robbers. They stripped him of his clothes, beat him and went away, leaving him half dead. A priest happened to be going down the same road, and when he saw the man, he passed by on the other side. So too, a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side. But a Samaritan came where the man was; and when he saw him, he took pity on him. He went to him and bandaged his wounds, pouring on oil and wine. Then he put the man on his own donkey, brought him to an inn and took care of him. The next day he took out two denarii and gave them to the innkeeper and said, 'Look after him and when I return, I will reimburse you for any extra expense you may have.'*

*"Which of these three do you think was a neighbor to the man who fell into the hands of robbers?"*

*The expert in the law replied, "The one who had mercy on him." Jesus told him, "Go and do likewise."*

### How are we to respond to the scourge of abortion and euthanasia in our culture?

We must have hope—we can change the world by caring for others.

Abortion and euthanasia are often seen as different issues, but in reality they share the same root: the killing of human life.

In the case of abortion, a woman might decide to have an abortion because she fears the future and feels that it's her only choice.

In the case of euthanasia, people often ask to have their lives ended because they fear future suffering or they feel that their life has no purpose. These feelings are natural for a person who has lost hope and is facing difficult circumstances.

Our response is to offer hope and to never abandon a person in need. Christians are called to journey with those who are sick, living with disabilities, or feeling lonely. When someone loses hope, it is our responsibility help them find hope and to be the face of God in their life.

Christians are called to change the world through evangelization and by standing up for the truth. This must never stop! The most effective way to change the world is through our shared experiences.

By showing compassion, caring for, and being with the sick, the dying, the lonely, and the pregnant woman who fears for her future, we will change the world one person at a time.



**An Inspired Attendee to the Movie UNPLANNED**

Tens of thousands of people took to the theatre in June and July to view the movie UNPLANNED. Despite the limited number of theatre locations and dates, we are grateful to theatres in Mississauga, Brampton and across Canada who showed the movie.

UNPANNED, is the story of Abby Johnson’s conversion from a former Planned Parenthood director, to uncompromising pro-life advocate, whose heart was converted after she watched, on an ultra sound screen, as a baby was being aborted in her clinic.

One anonymous movie-goer happened to go the extra mile by making and distributing baby (boy and girl) “nappies” to fellow movie-goers along with an inspiration biblical message.

On the back of the note, the writer added the following...

## Come Pray With Us!!

September 25th to November 3rd

**Right to Life Mississauga and Area** is the host of another *40 Days For Life* Campaign here in Mississauga. We hope and pray that you and your beautiful family, friends and organizations can and will participate. Please help spread the news of the campaign in any way possible. The more supporters we have, the bigger the impact. In this world of ‘rights’ and ‘entitlements’, someone has to stand up for the one who has no voice in this at all; the child in its mother’s womb.

We all know how important the gift of life is, how much it is under attack, and how many opponents surround us. We know that mass media is an ally to those who support abortion. So, we have to spread God’s truth in other ways. *40 Days for Life* draws attention to the realities of abortion, throughout a 40-day period, using a 3-point program: **Prayer and fasting, peaceful and prayerful vigil and community outreach.**

On Wednesday, Sept.25<sup>th</sup>, 40 Days for Life prayer vigils will be starting in 31 countries around the world (16 cities in Canada ) and continuing till Sunday Nov.3.

**Does it work? In a word YES !!!** Because of the prayerful presence in front of abortion facilities, God has moved in powerful and tangible ways. Since 2007, over one million people of different faiths and backgrounds have joined in prayer at multiple vigil sites. This has resulted in 16,004 lives saved, 191 abortion workers quitting their jobs and 104 abortion centres closed. These are the numbers we know of Only God knows the true tally. Here’s how the campaign is organized in our city. **Adopt-A-Day:** Each parish and/or organization commits to “staffing” a specific date with at least two prayer volunteers per hour from 7:00am to 7:00pm. Check your parish bulletin and information boards for your specific date(s). If the posted date is not good for you, or you wish to come on other days, please let us know by us know by signing into our 40Days for Life website: <https://40daysforlife.com/local-campaigns/mississauga/>.

**Feeling uneasy about praying at the vigil site?** The vigil is a legal exercise of our rights in cooperation with local authorities. Please note that the “new” location of the vigil site (where we stand) has been changed to conform with “bubble zone” regulations (out-side the 50-metre radius of the abortion clinic).

**New Vigil Site:** South side of Queensway Blvd. (about 50 paces west of Confederation Pkwy) immediately east of the 170 Queensway Medical Center walk-in clinic. Stand near the candy cane shaped vent stack or the railing at the back of the sidewalk.

**Parking:** Park your car at nearby at St. Catherine of Siena parish and walk a short distance to the vigil site. Go to the side door leading to the church hall. Sign in, gather your sign to read more about the vigil site location.

We have asked the Knights of Columbus councils to provide assistance to anyone who still feels uneasy. They will do their best to cover as many hours as possible.

The more the truth about abortion is understood, the more one realizes it is anti-life, anti-human and anti-woman. Abortion is different from any other modern social issue debated today.
